"Sorrel" in Caribbean usage refers to hibiscus (*Hibiscus sabdariffa*), not the European sorrel leaf. [Tropical Sun Sorrel and Ginger](#) is the classic Caribbean Christmas drink, vivid red hibiscus + warming ginger. Festive, refreshing, naturally tart. Drunk hot in winter, cold brewed for summer. Foundational to Caribbean Christmas hospitality.

In Caribbean cuisine, "sorrel" means hibiscus calyx (the cup shaped flower part). Botanically *Hibiscus sabdariffa*. Used across:

- Jamaica (sorrel drink at Christmas).
- Caribbean nations broadly.
- West Africa (where it's called "bissap" or "zobo").
- Mexico (where it's called "agua de jamaica").

Hot

1. 1 bag in 200ml just boiled water.
2. Steep 5-10 minutes (longer = more colour and tartness).
3. Sweeten with sugar or honey.

Caribbean Christmas drink (cold)

1. 2 bags in 1L cold water.
2. Refrigerate 8-24 hours.
3. Strain. Add sugar to taste.
4. Optional: add rum for adult version.
5. Serve over ice.

Buy [Tropical Sun Sorrel and Ginger](#) as the convenient bagged Caribbean Christmas cup. For the traditional preparation, buy [dried sorrel calyces](#) separately and brew loose with fresh ginger, cloves, and orange peel for the strongest possible cup. Compare with [straight hibiscus tea](#) for the single-herb version, and [West African bissap](#) for the Senegalese variant. [Fresh ginger root](#) alongside enhances any of these cups.
