Williamson English Breakfast is the brand's flagship single-origin Kenyan English Breakfast: estate-sourced, full-bodied, robust, in plastic-free silken pyramid bags. A premium-tier alternative to mainstream British English Breakfast ([Yorkshire](#) Tea, Tetley, PG Tips): brighter and more aromatic than those workhorses, more milk-friendly than a Sri Lankan or Indian first flush. The cup for drinkers who want a noticeable quality lift on their morning English Breakfast without going to specialty loose leaf.

## The product

Single-origin Kenyan [black tea](#), blended from Williamson's own estates in the Kericho and Kakamega regions. The silken pyramid bag matters: it lets the larger leaf pieces unfurl and brew more like loose leaf than like cut-and-sift bag tea. Plastic-free, biodegradable bag.

## How it tastes

Strong and malty in the British style, with a brighter coppery liquor than Yorkshire's deeper amber, a gentler astringency, and the faintly floral aromatic top note Kenyan tea is known for. It holds up to milk and sugar exceptionally; the floral note disappears with milk but the body stays. Curator Rating: 4.9/5.

## How to brew

1. 1 bag in 200ml just-boiled water (full boiling for black tea).
2. Steep 4 minutes; the pyramid format gives the leaf room to unfurl, so it takes a longer steep without going bitter.
3. Squeeze the bag gently against the cup wall before removing.
4. Add a splash of milk; whole milk is the traditional finish, but the brightness also takes oat milk well.
5. Sugar is optional; many drinkers find the leaf grade good enough not to need it.

Yorkshire Tea: a mass-market Assam-led workhorse at mainstream pricing. Tetley English Breakfast: a lighter blend, mass-market pricing. PG Tips: tannic, brisk, mass-market pricing. Williamson English Breakfast: single-origin Kenyan, premium pricing, brighter aromatic character. The leaf grade is the differentiator, larger pieces, more whole leaf, less astringency. Worth the upgrade for daily drinkers who notice the difference; mainstream Yorkshire is fine for everyday volume.

**Caffeine?** 40-50mg.

**Vegan?** Yes, with plant milk.

**Premium?** Yes; Kenyan single-origin, estate-sourced, premium pricing.

**Best with milk?** Yes; it holds up well, and milk softens the floral edge.

**vs Yorkshire?** Brighter, more aromatic, larger leaf grade, premium pricing.

**Pyramid bags?** Yes; plastic-free silken pyramid format.

## The Kenyan vs Indian Assam difference

Kenyan black tea (mainly from Kericho and the Mount Kenya regions) has a brighter, brisker, more astringent character than Indian Assam, which is malty, deep and full-bodied. Most mainstream UK English Breakfast blends use both, leaning Assam-heavy for depth. Williamson's 100% Kenyan base gives a notably different cup: less malty, more aromatic, brighter on the palate. For drinkers raised on Twinings or Yorkshire who find their cup too "thick" or "heavy", the Kenyan single-origin profile is often the right step. For drinkers who specifically want the Assam-led malty depth, Williamson reads as too light, so stick with Yorkshire Gold or an Assam-heavy supermarket blend.

## The estate-owned advantage

Williamson is one of the few UK tea brands that owns its source estates rather than blending bought-in tea from open-market auction. The Kenyan estates (around 5,000 hectares) supply the bulk of production with

tight quality control over picking, processing and packaging, which gives stronger consistency, better sustainability auditing and credible welfare claims than blender-only competitors. The trade-off is smaller scale and higher pricing. The elephant motif on the packaging comes from the brand's conservation partnership with the David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust, near Williamson's Mount Kenya estates; a percentage of revenue goes to elephant conservation work, auditable on the trust's reporting.

## The bottom line on Williamson English Breakfast

A premium single-origin Kenyan English Breakfast with credible estate-owned provenance and a clean, bright cup. Worth the step up from supermarket Twinings for weekend, guest, or considered moments; per-cup cost is 4-5x mainstream, so not the right daily-drinker for most households. The cleaner Kenyan profile suits drinkers who find Assam-led blends too heavy; for Assam fans, stick with Yorkshire Gold instead.

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
