**Yogi Organic Rose Tea is the brand's floral blend, built around rose petals with supporting [hibiscus](#), licorice, and rosehips. Delicate, slightly sweet, distinctive aromatic character that polarises drinkers, you either love it or find it perfumed. Worth trying for variety in a floral tea routine; not an everyday workhorse.**

## The blend

Rose petals form the aromatic backbone. Yogi's recipe includes hibiscus (tartness, deep red colour), licorice root (natural sweetness, no added sugar), rosehips (tang and vitamin C), cardamom and cinnamon (warmth), and [chamomile](#) (calming softness). The combination is more layered than rose only teas; rose tea purists may prefer a single herb option.

## How it tastes

Delicate floral lead from the rose, supported by hibiscus tartness and licorice's gentle sweetness. The aroma carries strongly; the cup tastes lighter than it smells. No bitterness, no astringency. A pleasant, perfumed cup that suits slow [afternoon](#) drinking. Curator Rating: 4.9/5.

## How to brew

1. 1 bag in 200ml just boiled water.
2. Cover the cup with a saucer to trap volatile aromatics.
3. Steep 5-7 minutes; rose tolerates a long steep without turning bitter.
4. Drink black; milk muddies the floral character.
5. A small drizzle of honey complements the rose if you want it sweeter.

- Bath time wind down ritual.
- After dinner cup when you want fragrance without caffeine.
- Variety in a floral tea rotation alongside chamomile and [lavender](#).

Madeleines, shortbread, lemon [biscuits](#), fresh strawberries, Turkish delight, or rose flavoured Middle Eastern sweets. Avoid heavy savoury food; the floral character clashes.

Premium tier within the wellness category. Typically 15-25p per bag at 17-bag pack pricing. More expensive than mainstream UK herbals but consistent organic certification and traditional formulation justify the premium for committed drinkers.

## Storage

Airtight tin or original packaging, kept away from light. Rose petals lose their volatile aromatics quickly; use within 9-12 months opened for the best aroma. Stored alongside spice heavy teas, the rose character will pick up cardamom and cinnamon notes from neighbouring boxes, store separately if you want clean rose flavour.

## The rose tradition

Rose-flavoured drinks and foods are a defining note of Persian, Ottoman and Indian Ayurvedic cooking, from Turkish lokum and Middle Eastern milk puddings to Indian gulab jamun. Dried rose petals are traditionally infused after meals as a perfumed, digestive conclusion to a formal welcome. The Yogi blend packages that tradition as a Western wellness tea. If you grew up with rose in food it will feel like familiar comfort; if you are

new to rose as a drink it is an acquired taste, soapy or perfumed at first for some, then a favourite after a few cups.

## Rose vs lavender and chamomile

Rose sits alongside lavender and chamomile in the soft-floral herbal family, but each has its own character. Chamomile is the most familiar to British drinkers, apple-soft and gentle. Lavender is more intensely floral, with a perfume edge that can tip into soapy in heavy doses. Rose sits between the two: a rounder floral character that suits drinkers who find chamomile too apple-sweet and lavender too perfumed. If you are exploring, try all three over a week and see which you bond with; most people settle on one as a default and keep the others in rotation.

## The bottom line on Yogi Rose Floral

A pleasantly distinctive floral herbal blend in the Yogi house style: multi-herb, warm-spiced, organic, divisive flavour profile. Worth trying if rose-flavoured drinks appeal or if you're exploring beyond the standard UK chamomile-peppermint herbal axis. The Middle Eastern and Persian culinary heritage adds context to the cup. Per-cup cost is on the higher end for herbal tea; if cost matters, try cheaper supermarket rose blends first to see if rose is a flavour you enjoy before committing to Yogi pricing.
