**[Yorkshire Tea Biscuit Brew](#)** is the brand's biscuit flavoured **[black tea](#)**: standard Yorkshire Tea base with vanilla, malt, and butter biscuit flavouring. The tea and biscuit dunk experience in a single cup. Started as a limited edition novelty in 2018; earned a permanent slot in the Yorkshire range through unexpected popularity. Tastes recognisably like a digestive or rich tea biscuit dunked in standard Yorkshire. Polarising on paper, loved by drinkers who try it.

## The blend

Yorkshire Tea base (the standard Assam led blend), natural vanilla flavouring, malt extract or malt flavouring, butter biscuit flavour. The bag looks like standard Yorkshire; the surprise is in the cup. The flavour profile sits between a digestive biscuit and a rich tea biscuit, with the malt giving it a subtle Hobnob like character.

## How it tastes

Standard Yorkshire body and malt come through, vanilla buttery sweetness on top, slight biscuit crumb finish. Tastes recognisably like dunking a digestive in your morning Yorkshire, except the cup is consistent

and you don't have crumbs at the bottom. Holds up to milk and sugar exactly like standard Yorkshire.

## How to brew

1. 1 bag in 200ml just boiled water.
2. Steep 3-4 minutes (full Yorkshire steep time).
3. Add a splash of milk; whole milk is the traditional finish but oat milk works particularly well with the biscuit notes.
4. Sugar is optional; the vanilla and malt flavouring already give perceived sweetness.
5. Pair ironically with a real biscuit for the full meta experience.

Yorkshire Tea launched Biscuit Brew in 2018 as a limited edition seasonal product, inspired by the British tea and biscuit dunk ritual. Initial sales projections were modest; actual sales overshot dramatically and the product earned a permanent slot in the standard Yorkshire range. It now sits alongside the brand's other "comfort flavour" products (Bedtime Brew with vanilla nutmeg, the discontinued Toast and Jam) as proof that flavoured British black tea has a genuine market when the flavour profile maps to existing British food memories.

## Caffeine

40-50mg per cup, in line with standard Yorkshire Tea.

Yes (with plant milk; verify pack as some batches use dairy derived butter flavouring).

- Sugar craving comfort drink for sugar managing drinkers.
- Novelty cup for guests or family.
- On the go tea when [biscuits](#) aren't to hand.
- Pairing with [afternoon](#) tea (yes, with real biscuits as well).
- Children's morning tea (well diluted with milk and sugar; the biscuit flavour appeals to kids).

## FAQ

**Caffeine?** 40-50mg.

**Vegan?** Yes typically (verify pack).

**Tastes like dunked biscuit?** Yes, recognisably.

**Permanent range?** Yes; launched 2018 as limited edition, earned permanent slot.

**[Pregnancy](#)?** Cap at 1-2 cups daily during pregnancy.

**Sugar?** No added sugar; the biscuit flavouring gives perceived sweetness without calories.

## Buying and storage

Available at UK supermarkets and online retailers; pack sizes typically run 15-bag to 80-bag. Store in an airtight tin or the original packaging, away from light, moisture and strong odours, and use within 12 months of opening.

## Pairings

- British biscuits (Digestives, Hobnobs, Custard Creams).
- Plain shortbread.
- Cake (Victoria sponge, Madeira, fruit cake).
- Light pastries and teacakes.

## The bottom line on Yorkshire Biscuit Brew

A novelty launch that earned permanent shelf space by being genuinely drinkable. The malty-biscuit flavour profile works as a familiar comfort cup, particularly in afternoon use paired with real biscuits. Worth keeping as a cupboard variation if you enjoy lightly-flavoured black tea; not a daily-drinker substitute for standard Yorkshire Tea. The Bettys & Taylors flavoured tea programme has been better-judged than many supermarket dessert-tea experiments.

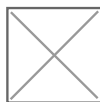
