

# Lipton Deep Dive: The Grocer Who Changed Tea

## The founder who was the brand

Lipton was built by Sir Thomas Lipton, a Glasgow grocer born in 1848 who turned a chain of shops into a global tea empire and made himself, the yachtsman and showman, into the advertising. His full biography is in [our Lipton profile](#); the short version is that he was one of the first people to understand the founder could sell the product.

## The idea that changed tea

Lipton's real innovation was vertical integration: in 1890 he bought tea estates in Ceylon and sold directly through his own shops, cutting out the brokers that kept tea expensive. The slogan "direct from the tea garden to the teapot" described a genuine supply-chain shortcut, and that estate-to-shelf model is now the industry norm, see [Ceylon tea](#) and [history of British tea](#).

The modern Lipton is a large international operation, and in the UK the range leans towards green and flavoured tea rather than the classic strong British black, the practical buying detail is in [best Lipton tea](#). The Earl Grey with Italian bergamot and the fruit greens are the value picks; for a traditional builder's brew the heritage giants fit better, see [best Yorkshire tea](#) and the [British tea brands hub](#).

It is worth separating the two clearly: the modern global Lipton is a different entity from the man, but the through line from his Ceylon estates to the brand is real. This is the same heritage-versus-ownership nuance our brand pages apply throughout, neither debunking the story nor repeating it credulously.

## How to brew it

Because the UK range is green-heavy, the key rule is water off the boil and a short steep, see [how to brew green tea](#); boiling water on green is the commonest reason people abandon it. The Earl Grey, being black, wants the opposite, full boiling water and a proper steep, see the [water temperature guide](#).

## Who it is for

Lipton in the UK is for the value-minded everyday green and flavoured drinker, especially iced, see the [iced tea recipes](#). For a strong British black cuppa, look elsewhere; for affordable, consistent green and a decent Earl Grey, it earns its place, and the founder story makes it one of the most genuinely historic names on the shelf.

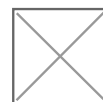
