## Stovetop kettle

Works without a dedicated appliance; slower, no temperature readout, fine but less convenient, .

## Gooseneck kettle

A narrow spout for controlled pouring; genuinely useful for matcha/pour over precision, niche for everyday tea, see [gooseneck kettle](#).

## The reboiling note

Whichever you use, freshly drawn water beats repeatedly reboiled flat water, see [best water for tea](#).

## How to choose

Most people: a basic (ideally variable temp) electric kettle. Precision/aesthetic brewers: gooseneck. Off grid: stovetop.

## Quick take

Electric is the sensible default; gooseneck is niche precision; temperature control matters more than kettle type, see [variable temperature kettle](#).

	Electric	Stovetop	Gooseneck
Speed	Fast	Slower	Fast (electric ones)
Temperature control	Best on variable temp models	None, no readout	Often variable, precise pour
Convenience	Highest, the default	Lower, no appliance needed	Niche, deliberate
Best for	Almost everyone	Off grid, no socket	Matcha, pour over precision
