

Teapigs Everyday Brew vs Yorkshire Tea Original

Quick answer: **Yorkshire Tea Original** is the practical 80-bag household brew; [Teapigs Everyday Brew](#) is a smaller 15-bag, larger-format tea-bag choice. Buy Yorkshire for dependable volume and milk-friendly strength; buy Teapigs when leaf room and a more deliberate cup matter more than pence per bag.

Both teas promise an everyday black cup, but they reach it through very different formats. This is a decision about how you brew and how quickly you use a box—not a contest decided by brand prestige.

The verdict in one mug

Yorkshire Original is easier to recommend to a busy household because the flavour brief, pack size and expected use are aligned: strong black tea, brewed often, usually with milk. [Teapigs Everyday Brew](#) suits somebody buying fewer bags and paying for a larger bag format. Neither is automatically “better”; they optimise different parts of the ritual.

Bag format changes the comparison

Counting bags alone hides the construction difference. Teapigs uses a roomier bag intended to let larger pieces move more freely, while Yorkshire uses the familiar everyday format people expect in a large caddy. That does not let us declare leaf quality from the outside, but it explains why the box sizes and per-bag prices sit so far apart.

Taste, milk and strength

Yorkshire Original is blended for a brisk, full cup that remains recognisable after milk. [Teapigs Everyday Brew](#) also occupies the classic black-tea lane, but the smaller pack encourages a more measured comparison. Brew both with the same water volume and time, taste first without milk, then add the same amount. Darker colour alone is not proof of more flavour.

Value without false equivalence

Yorkshire wins a simple pence-per-bag calculation. Teapigs asks whether the larger-format bag and smaller commitment are worth more to you. A bargain is only real if you enjoy the cup and finish the tea fresh; a premium format is only worthwhile if you notice and value the difference.

- **Run a fair home tasting:** same mug, fresh water, equal steep, no labels visible.
- **Store either well:** dry, airtight and away from coffee, spice and steam.

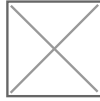
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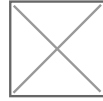
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
