

Wagon Wheels Original: the marshmallow round explained

Wagon Wheels Original: the marshmallow round explained, in summary: Two biscuit rounds, a marshmallow middle and a chocolate-flavoured coating, six to a 245g pack and each wrapped singly. The mallow relies on beef gelatine, so these are not for vegetarians.

Wagon Wheels have been in British biscuit tins since 1948, launched around the Olympia Food Fair that year and first baked by Weston [Biscuits](#) in Slough. The Original is the plain version: marshmallow between two rounds, with no jam.

What is inside a Wagon Wheel

The published ingredient list is a short build: a wheat-flour biscuit, a chocolate-flavoured coating at about 24% and a mallow filling at about 22%, followed by sugar, palm oil, glucose syrup, fat-reduced cocoa powder, a raising agent and salt. The label calls it a chocolate-flavoured coating, not [chocolate](#), and lists sugar, vegetable fats, dried whey and fat-reduced cocoa powder inside it.

The allergen statement for this barcode lists wheat (gluten), milk and soya. The mallow contains beef gelatine, so these are not suitable for vegetarians, and anyone who avoids gelatine for any reason should pass. As with anything on the biscuit shelf, the pack in your hand has the final word on the recipe.

Made to be eaten one at a time

Every round comes in its own wrapper, and the wrapper is doing a real job. Left open, a marshmallow filling hardens at the edge within a day, so sealing each round separately is what makes buying six at once sensible. It also makes this a natural lunchbox and desk-drawer biscuit: six portions, nothing to share out and no plate needed.

The texture is the other point in its favour. Nothing in it needs biting through, which makes it a kind choice for young children and for anyone who finds crunchy biscuits a struggle. It is soft, sweet and uncomplicated, and we would save it for the tea break that needs a lift rather than a refined afternoon plate.

Chilled, not dunked

This is not a [dunking](#) biscuit. In hot tea the coating, the soft filling and the two thin rounds all give up at once, each in its own way, so keep it beside the cup. In hot weather, pack it in a cool bag, because warmth loosens the marshmallow and softens the coating along with it.

Chilling is worth a try. Give it a full hour in the fridge rather than a quick twenty minutes, since a marshmallow centre takes longer to firm up than a coating does, and the round eats chewier and less cloying. A strong, plain [black tea](#) suits it, and so does a milky coffee; the sweetness needs a drink with some grip rather than a delicate cup.

FAQ

Are Wagon Wheels vegetarian? No. The published ingredient list includes beef gelatine in the mallow, so the Original is not suitable for vegetarians.

What allergens are in Wagon Wheels Original? The allergen statement for this barcode lists wheat (gluten), milk and soya. Check the current pack, as recipes can change.

Is an Original Wagon Wheel better chilled? If you like them chewier, yes. About an hour firms the marshmallow; twenty minutes is not long enough to make much difference.

Can you dunk a Wagon Wheel? No. The all-over coating stops tea soaking in evenly, and the filling and rounds give way at different speeds, so eat it beside the cup.

Which Wagon Wheel has jam in it? The Jammie version adds a layer of jam. The Original is marshmallow only, and the two boxes look much alike, so read the front before you buy.

Curator's note: Give the pack an hour in the fridge before a picnic and carry it in the cool bag. A cold Wagon Wheel and a flask of strong tea is the best version of it. Lee, Teas.co.uk, Tunbridge Wells.

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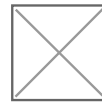
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
