Dragonfly, in brief: Dragonfly is a UK independent organic specialist built on caffeine-free herbal and rooibos infusions in plant-based pyramid bags. The plain deep dive.

Dragonfly Tea is one of the British [organic tea](#) pioneers, founded in London in 1990 with a focus on combining authentic origin sourcing, organic certification, and ethical trade practices in a comprehensive premium tea range. The brand has built one of the more distinctive premium tea positions in British retail through a combination of organic forward range, single origin sourcing relationships, and sustainability focused packaging innovation. Dragonfly was an early mover in the UK organic tea space and has retained its independent ownership through 35 years of operation.

This guide is a deep dive into Dragonfly: the founding organic pioneer story, the comprehensive range across true tea and herbal categories, the rooibos and pyramid bag innovations, the [sustainability](#) commitments, and how to navigate one of the more interesting independent premium tea catalogues in British retail.

The Dragonfly [Tea history](#)

Dragonfly Tea was founded in 1990 in London during the early wave of the British organic and ethical trade movement. The brand was created to bring authentic, organic forward, sustainably sourced teas to the British market at a time when most premium tea brands were still focused on heritage positioning rather than sourcing transparency.

The brand grew steadily through the 1990s and 2000s by building direct relationships with tea growing communities, prioritising organic certified leaf, and developing a distinctive premium range across true tea and herbal categories. Dragonfly has remained independently owned through 35 years of operation, which is increasingly unusual in the British tea industry where most premium brands have been acquired by larger FMCG groups.

Notable milestones in the brand's history:

- **1990** founded in London during the early UK organic food wave
- **1990s onwards** building direct supplier relationships with organic certified estates
- **2000s** expansion into [supermarket](#) distribution alongside the existing wholefood store presence
- **2010s** introduction of plant based pyramid bags and broader sustainability initiatives
- **Continues** as an independent British premium tea brand with comprehensive organic range

The independent ownership has provided continuity of approach across decades when many competitor brands have changed hands. Dragonfly's positioning, range, and sustainability commitments have evolved gradually rather than through ownership driven brand resets.

The organic and ethical positioning

Dragonfly's brand identity is built around organic certification and ethical sourcing. The brand was an early UK adopter of comprehensive organic positioning, predating the organic tea expansion of brands like Pukka (founded 2001) and Clipper's organic launch (1999). This early mover position has given Dragonfly long term credibility in the organic tea space.

The current organic and ethical positioning covers:

- **Organic certification** across most of the range, particularly the herbal and rooibos lines
- **Direct trade relationships** with grower communities, particularly in South Africa (rooibos) and Sri Lanka (Ceylon teas)
- **Plant based pyramid bags** fully compostable bag materials introduced ahead of many competitors
- **Carbon neutral operations** through offsetting programmes
- **Recyclable and reduced plastic packaging** across the range

The credentials are broadly comparable to Pukka and Clipper in scope, with the distinguishing feature being Dragonfly's longer independent ownership track record. For consumers who specifically value mission driven independent brands over corporate owned organic positioning, Dragonfly's continued independent ownership is part of the appeal.

The Dragonfly range

Dragonfly's range covers a wider variety of categories than most premium organic competitors, including significant true tea offerings alongside the herbal range. Major categories:

Rooibos and red bush:

- **Dragonfly Organic Rooibos** the brand's flagship rooibos product, organic certified plain rooibos

- **Dragonfly Organic Vanilla Rooibos** vanilla flavoured organic rooibos
- **Dragonfly Organic Caramel Rooibos** the sweeter caramel flavoured variant
- **Dragonfly Organic [Rooibos Chai](#)** spiced rooibos as a caffeine free chai alternative
- **Dragonfly Organic [Honeybush](#)** the related South African red bush plant with natural honey like sweetness

[Black tea:](#)

- **Dragonfly [Ceylon Tea](#)** single origin Sri Lankan black tea
- **Dragonfly English Breakfast** the classic British morning blend in organic format
- **Dragonfly Earl Grey** organic bergamot black tea
- **Dragonfly Decaf** the decaf version of the everyday black tea

Green tea:

- **Dragonfly Organic Green Tea** plain organic green tea
- **Various flavoured green tea blends** lemon, mint, jasmine variants

Herbal infusions:

- **Dragonfly Organic Peppermint** single ingredient organic peppermint
- **Dragonfly Organic Camomile** single ingredient organic chamomile
- **Dragonfly Organic Lemon & Ginger** the classic warming blend
- **Various wellness blends** sleep, calm, detox, immunity positioned products

Specialty:

- **Dragonfly Organic Matcha Green** matcha style green tea blend
- **Dragonfly Organic Pu erh** fermented Chinese style pu erh tea (less common in mainstream British retail)

The range is comparable in breadth to Pukka but with stronger representation in the rooibos and true tea categories. For drinkers wanting a single brand that covers organic black, green, rooibos, and herbal options, Dragonfly is one of the more comprehensive choices.

The rooibos focus

One of Dragonfly's distinctive product strengths is its comprehensive rooibos range. The brand has built one of the more diverse rooibos selections in British retail, including:

- Plain organic rooibos
- Multiple flavoured rooibos variants
- Rooibos chai blends
- Rooibos and honeybush combinations

The rooibos range is part of Dragonfly's identity and reflects long standing direct sourcing relationships with South African rooibos producers. For drinkers building a comprehensive rooibos cupboard, Dragonfly offers more variety than most competitor brands. The plant based pyramid bag

Dragonfly was an early adopter of plant based, fully compostable pyramid bag formats, introducing the format ahead of many larger competitors. The bag materials are derived from plant cellulose rather than the polypropylene used in conventional pyramid bags, addressing the plastic in tea bags concern that became a major consumer issue in the late 2010s.

The plant based bag has the same brewing characteristics as conventional pyramid bags (3D shape giving leaves room to circulate, faster infusion than flat bags) without the plastic residue concern. The bags are fully home compostable and break down in standard composting conditions.

This early adoption gave Dragonfly credibility on the sustainability axis when the broader industry was still using plastic containing bags; the brand has maintained the plant based format consistently across the range.

Dragonfly vs the competition

Dragonfly's main competitors vary by category:

- **vs Pukka** both are premium organic herbal brands; Pukka has stronger Ayurvedic positioning and B Corp credentials, Dragonfly has longer independent ownership track record and stronger rooibos focus
- **vs Clipper** both are organic and ethical brands; Clipper is more focused on Fairtrade certification and broader supermarket distribution, Dragonfly has stronger pyramid bag premium positioning
- **vs Heath & Heather** both are organic herbal brands at similar price points; both have credible long standing positioning
- **vs Teapigs** both use pyramid bag formats with whole leaf or whole piece ingredients; Dragonfly has stronger organic positioning, Teapigs has broader brand voice and recognition
- **vs supermarket own label organic ranges** Dragonfly has stronger brand credibility and broader range than typical supermarket organic alternatives

Dragonfly's competitive position is strongest with drinkers who specifically value independent ownership combined with comprehensive organic positioning and pyramid bag premium quality. The brand sits in a distinctive niche between the larger corporate owned organic brands (Pukka, Clipper) and the broader specialty premium brands (Teapigs).

The Dragonfly ethical sourcing position

Dragonfly's ethical credentials are built on:

- **Comprehensive organic certification** across most of the range
- **Direct trade relationships** with grower communities in source countries
- **Plant based, plastic free bag materials** introduced ahead of many competitors
- **Carbon offsetting programmes** for operations and shipping
- **Recyclable and reduced packaging** across the range
- **Independent UK ownership** providing continuity of mission driven positioning

The credentials are solid and broadly comparable to Pukka and Clipper, with the distinguishing feature being the independent ownership. For consumers who specifically prioritise independent businesses over corporate owned organic brands, Dragonfly's continued independence is meaningful.

How to brew Dragonfly properly

Standard tea style brewing applies, varying by tea type:

- **Black tea** just off boiling water, 3 to 4 minutes for whole leaf pyramid bags
- **Green tea** cooled water (70 to 80°C), 2 to 3 minutes
- **Rooibos** just off boiling water, 5 to 7 minutes; doesn't go bitter with extended brewing
- **Herbal infusions** just off boiling water, 5 to 10 minutes for full extraction
- **Pu erh** just off boiling water, 4 to 6 minutes; brews stronger and darker than other tea families

The plant based pyramid bags brew identically to conventional pyramid bags; no special handling required. For the family by family brewing temperature detail see the [water temperatures guide](#).

Dragonfly is the British independent organic tea brand that's built credible mission driven positioning across 35 years of operation. The combination of comprehensive organic range, distinctive rooibos focus, plant based pyramid bag format, and continued independent ownership makes it a genuinely interesting alternative to the larger corporate owned organic brands.

For drinkers who specifically value independent ownership combined with organic positioning, Dragonfly is a meaningful choice. For drinkers who don't specifically prioritise the independent ownership angle, Pukka and Clipper offer broadly comparable organic range coverage at similar quality levels with different brand positioning angles.

The brand's smaller scale relative to Pukka and Clipper means narrower supermarket distribution and less marketing visibility, which is part of why some drinkers may not have encountered it despite its 35-year history. For drinkers exploring the British organic tea space, Dragonfly is worth knowing about as one of the more authentic independent options in the category.

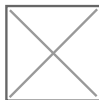

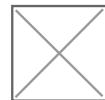
