

# Yogi Tea

**Yogi Tea, in brief:** Yogi Tea is the US-founded ayurvedic herbal brand widely available in UK health shops. What the blends actually do, ingredient quality, and best buys.

**Yogi Tea is the American wellness tea brand built around the Ayurvedic and Yogic traditions brought to the West by Yogi Bhanjan in the 1960s and 1970s.** Founded in 1984 in Eugene, Oregon, the brand has built a comprehensive range of functionally positioned herbal blends that's now distributed across more than 40 countries including the UK, where Yogi Tea sits as one of the more distinctive American format wellness brands on British shelves. The brand's spice forward [blending](#) style and explicit Yogic philosophy positioning provides a different cultural angle to the British shelf wellness tea category dominated by Pukka and Clipper. This guide is a deep dive into Yogi Tea: the founding story tied to Yogi Bhanjan and Kundalini Yoga, the comprehensive functional range, the spice forward American style blending, and how to navigate one of the more distinctive wellness tea catalogues in British retail.

Yogi Tea was founded in 1984 in Eugene, Oregon by students of Yogi Bhanjan, the Sikh spiritual teacher who brought Kundalini Yoga to the West in the late 1960s. The original "Yogi Tea" recipe was a spiced milk and tea preparation that Yogi Bhanjan served to his Kundalini Yoga students in the 1970s; the commercial brand grew from packaging and marketing this traditional recipe alongside variants for specific health and wellness purposes.

The brand grew through the 1980s and 1990s as the natural foods and wellness movement expanded in the US, becoming one of the dominant wellness tea brands in American natural food retail. Yogi Tea expanded internationally in the 2000s, including UK distribution through specialty health food retailers and gradually broader [supermarket](#) presence.

Notable milestones in the brand's history:

- **1984** founded in Eugene, Oregon by students of Yogi Bhanjan
- **1990s** expansion across US natural foods retail
- **2000s** international expansion including UK distribution
- **2010s** broader UK supermarket presence and range expansion
- **2018 onwards** navigating the complicated legacy of Yogi Bhanjan after multiple credible allegations of abuse against him surfaced; the brand has formally distanced itself from Yogi Bhanjan personally while continuing to use the Yogi name
- **Continues** as a major US wellness tea brand with broad international distribution

The Yogi Bhanjan legacy issue is worth flagging: substantive allegations of abuse and misconduct against Yogi Bhanjan emerged from former students starting in 2020 and have been widely reported. Yogi Tea (the brand) has taken steps to distance itself from Yogi Bhanjan personally while retaining the brand name and the broader Yogic philosophy positioning that goes beyond his individual teachings. For consumers navigating this complicated legacy in their purchasing decisions, the brand's response and ongoing actions are part of the picture.

## The American spice forward style

Yogi Tea's blends use a distinctly American wellness tea style that differs from the British and European herbal traditions. The Yogi style emphasises:

- **Bold spice profiles** often featuring cinnamon, cardamom, ginger, cloves, and black pepper as primary flavour notes
- **Functional positioning** around specific wellness goals, with each blend designed for a clear purpose (sleep, energy, [immunity](#), [digestion](#))
- **Ayurvedic influenced ingredient combinations** drawing from the Indian herbal medicine tradition
- **Yogic philosophy framing** with each tea bag carrying an inspirational quote or thought
- **Larger blends** typically combining 6-10 different herbs and spices per tea, more complex than typical British herbal tea recipes

The American spice forward style produces a noticeably different cup character than British herbal teas. Where Pukka or Clipper might use a single dominant herb plus 2-3 supporting ingredients, Yogi blends often use more complex combinations that produce fuller, spicier, more layered cups. Some drinkers love this complexity; others find it overwhelming compared to simpler British herbal blends.

## The Yogi range

Yogi has built one of the broader functional wellness tea ranges available in British retail. Major categories:

#### **Sleep and calm:**

- **Yogi Bedtime Tea** the flagship sleep blend with [chamomile](#), [lavender](#), [valerian](#), and other relaxing herbs
- **Yogi a quiet moment** eleuthero and other adaptogenic herbs for stress management
- **Yogi Calming Tea** milder calm blend for daytime use
- **Yogi Honey Lavender a quiet moment** the popular lavender and honey calming variant

#### **Energy and immunity:**

- **Yogi Cold Season Tea** the cold and flu blend with elderberry, echinacea, and immune herbs
- **Yogi Echinacea Immune Support** focused echinacea led blend
- **Yogi Vitality** energy focused blend with eleuthero and ginseng
- **Yogi Green Tea Energy** green tea based energy blends

#### **Digestion:**

- **Yogi Ginger Tea** classic warming ginger blend
- **Yogi Stomach Ease** digestive focused blend with peppermint, fennel, and ginger
- **Yogi everyday cup** the everyday cup positioned blend (with the standard caveat that everyday cup claims are mostly marketing)

#### **Chai:**

- **Yogi Chai Tea** the original Yogi Tea recipe in tea bag format, the historical foundation of the brand
- **Yogi Vanilla Spice** vanilla chai variant
- **Yogi Cocoa Spice** cocoa and chai variant
- **Yogi Chocolate Mint** dessert style indulgent blend

#### **Women's wellness:**

- **Yogi Woman's Energy** hormone balance positioned blend
- **Yogi Pregnancy Tea** raspberry leaf based pregnancy support blend (consult midwife before use)
- **Yogi Mother to Be** similar pregnancy positioning

#### **Other functional:**

- **Yogi Skin everyday cup** skin focused herbal blend
- **Yogi Throat Comfort** sore throat blend
- **Yogi Joint Comfort** antioxidant positioned blend

The range is more functionally specific than most British competitors; for almost any wellness goal you can think of, Yogi has a tea positioned for it. Whether the functional positioning translates to actual measurable effects varies (some have decent evidence bases; many are more aspirational), but the range breadth is

genuinely useful for drinkers building a varied wellness tea cupboard.

## The inspirational quote tradition

One of Yogi Tea's distinctive brand features: each individual tea bag carries an inspirational quote or thought, printed on the tea bag tag. The quotes are designed to provide a moment of reflection during the tea drinking ritual, drawing from Yogic philosophy, mindfulness traditions, and motivational thinking.

The quote on the tag feature has been part of Yogi Tea since the early days and is one of the brand's most recognised distinguishing features. For drinkers who appreciate the contemplative angle, the quotes add a small ritual element to the daily cup; for drinkers who find the inspirational quote format twee, it can feel slightly forced. Either way it's part of what makes Yogi Tea distinct from competitor brands that focus more strictly on the product itself.

## The organic positioning

Most Yogi Tea products are USDA Organic certified (the American organic standard, broadly equivalent to EU organic standards). The brand has comprehensive organic positioning across most of its range, comparable to Pukka and Clipper in scope.

The organic certification covers both the herbal ingredients and the spice components, with direct sourcing relationships in the source countries. For consumers who prioritise organic certification, Yogi is one of the major American organic tea brands available in British retail.

## Yogi vs the competition

Yogi competes against several wellness tea brands in British retail:

- **vs Pukka** both are organic wellness tea brands; Pukka is British with Ayurvedic positioning, Yogi is American with Yogic positioning. Pukka has broader UK distribution; Yogi has more complex spice forward blends and the inspirational quote feature
- **vs Clipper** Clipper has British Fairtrade and organic positioning at lower prices; Yogi has more functional specific blends and stronger spice character
- **vs Twinings wellness range** Twinings offers similar functional positioning at lower prices but without the same organic certification or distinctive blend style

- **vs Heath & Heather** both are organic leaning herbal brands; Heath & Heather is British and longer established in UK retail

Yogi's competitive position is strongest with drinkers who specifically value the spice forward American style and the broad functional blend range. For drinkers who prefer simpler herbal infusions or more familiar British style blends, Pukka and Clipper are usually better fits.

## How to brew Yogi properly

Yogi blends benefit from full extraction to develop the complex spice profiles:

1. **Use freshly drawn cold water** brought to a rolling boil for herbal blends
2. **Pour over the bag immediately**
3. **Steep for 7 minutes minimum** longer than most British herbal teas; the spice forward American blends need extended brewing to release the full complex character
4. **Some blends benefit from 10+ minutes** particularly the chai variants and the heavy spice immunity blends
5. **Don't add milk** to most Yogi blends except the chai variants where milk is traditional
6. **Sweetening optional** the spice character is often complex enough to drink unsweetened

The longer brewing time is the main practical difference from typical British herbal teas; drinkers used to 3-4 minute brewing may find Yogi blends underwhelming until they extend the steep time. For the family by family brewing temperature detail see the [water temperatures guide](#).

Yogi Tea is the American wellness tea brand with a distinctive spice forward style and broad functional blend range. The combination of organic certification, complex multi herb blends, Yogic philosophy framing, and

the inspirational quote feature makes it a genuinely different proposition from the British wellness tea brands. For drinkers who specifically enjoy the American spice forward herbal style or want functional positioning across very specific wellness goals, Yogi is a worthwhile alternative to British equivalents. For drinkers who prefer simpler British style herbal infusions or are looking for the cleanest organic and Fairtrade positioning, Pukka and Clipper are usually better fits.

The Yogi Bhajan legacy is part of the broader picture for some consumers; the brand has formally distanced itself from his individual teachings while retaining the broader Yogic and Ayurvedic philosophical framework. For consumers navigating this complicated history in their purchasing decisions, the brand's actions and ongoing positioning are worth considering alongside the product quality.
