

Loose Leaf Tea: Why It Is Better, and Barely Harder

Loose leaf tea, in summary: Loose leaf is the older, more characterful format: larger intact leaf with room to unfurl giving a fuller, more complex, re-steepable cup, barely harder than bags.

Loose leaf tea is the older, better, more characterful format, whole or larger piece tea leaves brewed in a teapot or infuser without the bag. The cup is dramatically more aromatic and complex than tea bag brewing, and not significantly more difficult to make.

Why loose leaf is better

1. Whole leaves preserve aromatic compounds

Tea bags contain "fannings" or "dust", small broken pieces with maximum surface area. Fast extraction, but volatile aromatic compounds escape rapidly during processing and storage. Whole leaf tea retains aromatics that bags lose.

2. More complex flavour

Whole leaves release flavour gradually, bright top notes early, body in the middle, gentle finish at the end. Tea bags release everything in 60-90 seconds, then mostly extract bitter tannins.

3. Multiple infusions

Quality loose leaf can be steeped 2-3 times (Western brewing) or 4-8 times (gongfu brewing). Each infusion is slightly different in character. Tea bags are 1-and done.

4. Better quality leaf overall

Premium tea is sold loose. Tea bags are usually filled with lower grade processing offcuts. Even mid tier loose tea exceeds premium tea bag tea in cup quality.

5. Less environmental impact

No bag material. Just leaves. Compostable directly.

Standard objections, and the reality:

"It takes longer."

It doesn't. The brewing time is the same; you just put leaves in a pot or infuser instead of a bag in a mug. Maybe 30 seconds extra at the start.

"You need special [equipment](#)."

You need a teapot (£10-30) OR an infuser basket (£5-15) OR a mesh ball (£3). All of these last years. None require specialist knowledge.

"Cleaning is hard."

Pour the spent leaves into the compost bin (or food waste). Rinse the pot. 30 seconds.

"It's expensive."

Premium loose leaf is more expensive per gram than tea bags, but you typically use less per cup AND can re steep, so per cup cost is comparable. Mid tier loose leaf is competitive with premium tea bags.

The basic loose leaf brewing protocol

For a teapot (4-cup)

1. Pre warm the pot with a splash of boiling water; pour out.
2. Add 4 heaped teaspoons of leaves (1 per cup).
3. Pour boiling water (800ml).
4. Steep the appropriate time for the tea type.
5. Pour through a strainer into cups.

For a single mug with infuser basket

1. Place 1 heaped teaspoon of leaves in the infuser basket.
2. Place infuser in the mug.
3. Pour 200ml boiling water (or appropriate [temperature](#) for the tea).
4. Steep the appropriate time.
5. Remove the infuser. Drink.

For mesh ball (least convenient)

1. Fill mesh ball with 1 heaped teaspoon of loose leaves.
2. Place ball in mug; pour boiling water over.
3. Steep; remove the ball.

Mesh balls work but produce slightly weaker cups than infuser baskets (less leaf to water contact).

Equipment for loose leaf brewing

- **Teapot.** Glass, ceramic, or porcelain. £10-30 for decent quality.
- **Infuser basket.** Stainless steel mesh with handles. Sits in any mug. £5-15.
- **Mesh ball.** Cheap (£3) but suboptimal extraction.
- **Gaiwan (Chinese specialty).** Lidded cup for gongfu brewing. £10-30.
- **Yixing teapot (Chinese clay).** Premium specialist. £30-100+.
- **Strainer.** Fine mesh for pouring through if leaves swim freely.

Tea	Bag suitability	Loose leaf advantage
British black tea (CTC)	Optimised for bags	Modest improvement loose
Earl Grey	Both work	Bergamot more vivid loose
Darjeeling	Acceptable bags	Significantly better loose
Japanese sencha	Suboptimal in bags	Dramatically better loose
Chinese green (Long Jing)	Rarely in bags	Loose only for premium
Oolong	Rarely in bags	Loose only for premium
White tea	Some bagged	Better loose for delicacy
Pu erh	Limited bagged options	Loose or compressed cake

Storage of loose leaf tea

Same principles as tea bags, airtight, cool, dark, away from strong odours. Loose leaf actually has BETTER storage stability than bags because the leaves haven't been broken into fast degrading small pieces.

The cost question

Per cup pricing comparison (rough):

- **Yorkshire Tea bags:** £0.04 per cup
- **Mid tier loose leaf English Breakfast:** £0.08-0.15 per cup
- **Premium single origin loose leaf:** £0.30-0.80 per cup
- **Specialty Chinese loose leaf (multiple infusions):** £0.10-0.30 per cup amortised

Loose leaf is more expensive but the cup quality justifies the spend for many drinkers.

FAQ

Is loose leaf tea better than tea bags? Yes, significantly better cup quality, more complex flavour, multiple infusions possible.

Is it more difficult to brew? No, 30 seconds extra time at the start. Pot, infuser, or mesh ball makes it easy.

Best equipment to start? A 600-800ml teapot + a fine strainer. £15-25 total.

Where to buy loose leaf tea UK? Specialist retailers (teas.co.uk, Whittard, Mei Leaf, Postcard Teas). Some major supermarkets carry loose leaf in their premium ranges.

Loose leaf vs bags for daily drinking? For weekday convenience, bags. For weekend appreciation or guest quality cups, loose leaf.

Curator's note: most British tea drinkers grew up on bags and never tried loose leaf seriously. The shift is dramatic, same brand, same style, completely different cup quality. Worth investing £20 in a teapot + strainer + mid tier loose leaf to experience properly. Lee, Teas.co.uk, Tunbridge Wells.
