

Peppermint: Growing, Foraging and Cooking

Peppermint (the plant), in summary: Peppermint (*Mentha x piperita*) is a watermint-spearmint hybrid; very easy to grow, classic Black Mitcham English cultivar, menthol provides cooling.

Peppermint is the menthol rich hybrid of watermint and spearmint, the medicinal mint, the IBS evidenced mint, the post meal mint. It's been cultivated across Europe and North Africa since at least the 18th century, and the UK has its own peppermint growing tradition (Black Mitcham peppermint from Surrey is historically renowned).

The plant

Peppermint (*Mentha piperita*) is a hybrid that arose in 17th century England between watermint (*Mentha aquatica*) and spearmint (*Mentha spicata*). The hybrid produces:

- Higher menthol content than parent species (40-50% of essential oil)
- Sharper cooling sensation
- Stronger traditional uses

The famous Black Mitcham variety from Surrey was particularly highly regarded historically. Modern peppermint is grown commercially across Europe, the US (Pacific Northwest especially), India, and other regions.

The cooling sensation explained

Menthol triggers cold sensing receptors (TRPM8) in the mouth, throat, and skin without actually lowering [temperature](#). This produces the distinctive "cooling" sensation that defines peppermint. The same receptors respond to actual cold; menthol "tricks" them.

Beyond the cooling, menthol has:

- Antispasmodic effects on intestinal smooth muscle
- Antibacterial properties
- Mild analgesic effects (cooling reduces pain perception)
- Decongestant effects (opens nasal passages)

Tea bags / loose leaf tea

Dried peppermint leaves brewed as infusion. The standard daily drinking format. [Detailed benefits guide](#).

Peppermint oil capsules

Concentrated peppermint oil in enteric coated capsules. Designed to deliver oil to the small intestine. Strongest evidence for IBS support. Brands: Colpermin, Mintec.

Peppermint essential oil

Concentrated oil for aromatherapy or topical use. Don't ingest neat, too concentrated.

Peppermint extract / flavouring

For baking and cooking. Real peppermint oil diluted in alcohol or oil base.

Brewing peppermint tea

1. 1 bag (or 1 tsp dried peppermint) per 200ml.
2. Just boiled water.
3. Cover the cup. Steep 5-7 minutes.
4. Drink black, with lemon, or with honey.

The Black Mitcham heritage

Mitcham, Surrey was historically the centre of UK peppermint production from the 18th to mid-20th century. "Black Mitcham" peppermint was renowned for its high quality essential oil and was exported globally. Most UK peppermint production has since moved abroad, but the Black Mitcham name persists as a quality marker for some products.

Peppermint grows easily in UK gardens, in fact, it spreads invasively. Pick fresh leaves; brew immediately for best aromatic intensity. Or dry on a tray for storage tea.

Wild peppermint can be found in damp areas, hedgerows, woodland edges. Identification: opposite leaf pairs, square stems (mint family characteristic), distinct cool menthol smell when crushed.

- **Reflux/GERD.** Peppermint can worsen reflux in some sufferers.
- **Pregnancy.** 1-2 cups daily is generally fine. Some sources advise caution against high volume in first trimester.
- **Young children.** Avoid peppermint oil for children under 5; tea strength is gentler but worth caution.
- **Gallstones.** Peppermint may stimulate bile flow.

- After heavy meals (digestive)
- IBS related discomfort
- Cold and flu (decongestant via steam)
- Tension headaches (mild)
- Bad breath
- Caffeine free refreshing daytime / evening drink
- Cold brewed iced summer drinks

FAQ

What is peppermint? A hybrid mint species with high menthol content. Strongly cooling, medicinal grade aromatic.

Caffeine? 0mg.

Best for digestion? Yes, strong clinical evidence for IBS support; modest for general digestive comfort.

Can children drink it? Older children yes (5+); avoid for babies and very young children.

Pregnancy safe? 1-2 cups daily generally fine. Avoid concentrated peppermint oil.

Curator's note: peppermint is one of the most reliably useful herbal teas. Strong digestive evidence, no caffeine, freshly cooling. The Pukka Three Mint blend is the daily one I keep at home; pure peppermint for specific IBS style discomfort. Lee, Teas.co.uk, Tunbridge Wells.

Aspect	The note
Latin	Mentha x piperita (hybrid: watermint + spearmint)
UK habitat	Gardens, hedgerows, damp ground, riverbanks
Distinguishing trait	Strong menthol cool sensation; serrated dark green leaves
Black Mitcham	Famous English cultivar from Surrey, 18th century
Active compound	Menthol (40-60% of essential oil)
Growing	Very easy; invasive in beds; grow in pots
Picking	Late spring through autumn; young tops best
Drying	Simple; tied bunches in dry airy place 5-7 days

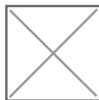
